But fear not the difference between the real-thing and the fake are fairly easy to spot, we have even done a You Tube video on this very title and this flagrantly shameful counterfeit exposed with matrix images and deadwax pitting. Search for "Manship Bootlegs episode 3"

Meantime gaze upon this plain-face of gorgeousness that so many have dreamed of owning, but those opportunities are few and far between with competition mounting on the rare occasions it comes to market.

Both sides by this "one-shot" Philly girl-group who became the city's premier girl gathering as "Honey & The Bees". Jerry Ross along with Neil Brian, Joe Renzetti reactivated with "Gonna Be a Big Thing" with The Sapphires a little later. As did Johnny Pate with "Looky Looky" giving The Kittens a shot at the Ashford-Simpson-Armstead" dancer..

Few, if any Northern Soul collector or DJs want counterfeits, reissues, later versions, they want the real deal.. Ingrained into the very fabric of the Northern Soul devotee, is the need, dedication and motivation to own the real-deal first incarnation of the Northern Soul greats..

NOthing I can say will elevate the love & respect this man commands within tye Northern Soul community. Ray delivered a vocal that sent shivers through you, emotions only a truly great voice can trigger. A show-stopping vocal of mammoth proportions, with his seemingly effortless manipulation of the Big City Sound.. a Northern Soul legend indeed.

Here's a song that has lived in the shadows of "The Drifter" for arguably far too long. Listen to Mr. Pollard stroll through the opening bars, then as Jerry Granahan & Arnold Goland signal a quickening of the pace, an amplification of the horns. Ray's vocal responds in a heartbeat; just like the thoroughbred he is, instant acceleration of delivery and not an ounce of power dropped, as he tears into another Big City Beast Ballad.

Without question "The Drifter" is a masterpiece, but also undeniable is the quality that seeps from the grooves of this 1965 follow up to his greatest moment..
