Stubborn Heart / How Do You Like It Mirwood : 5534 DJ (45s)

It matters not what which side you drop the arm on, with this wonderful Chicago born, Los Angeles licensed double helping of proper vocal group Northern Soul awaits you.

Eddie LaShea composed both sides for this much-recorded 6 man gathering, who's experience shines through from the very first line to the last.

Vocally more subtle than Ernest Mosely's rasping version. LeShea gently guides this seasoned gathering in on Kermit Chandler's rippling guitar pulses, inviting Murrie Eskridge higher pitched vocal to lead the way for

O. C. Perkins, Mill Evans, James Issac and James Allen to cradle his reaching vocal through a truly beseeching song.

It is too easy to lead by raving about "Stubborn Heart" as the trail has already been ridden by Ernest's much loved NS anthem. Which tends to leave a superb slab of vocal-group Northern Soul on the flipside in undeservedly partly hidden from the NS dancers. The flip "How Do You Like It" another Eddie LaShea creation is for me one of those neglected tunes that underline the unnecessary tunnel-vision Northern Soul has always suffered from. If today "How Do You Like It" had just been discovered the asking price would be eye-watering.

Take a listen to a stirring Northern Soul flipside begging to add an element of surprise to any Northern Soul set. It is a record that shimmers with an additive zipping string arrangement coupled with an insistent perussion beating out the time, fabulous "Kirmit" bass guitar bridges, tight as a drum harmonies meld seamlessly into a classy Northern Soul dancer. An overlooked recording that is right up there with Chicago's best.

You will find a couple of plays is not enough for this gem, as the swirling string section will imprison you completely, sounding more like a Don Davis Groovesville production than an Eddie LaShea choice of Chicago flipside.

Two superb tunes, topside already a fully appreciative dancefloor pleaser, the flipside saturated in undeniable brilliance, begging for long overdue concerted NS attention.

DOG RARE!!

The seldom seen sister version of the Tommy Marks uncompromising Northern Soul stomper. This take pressed on the 16th. April 1966, sadly fell into instant obscurity. Even in the UK Tommy Marks's version is by far the better known of the two, whilst in my opinion Little Jeanette is the superior slab of Northern Soul.

Her purring smoky vocal perfectly fitting the more considerately paced of the vibe driven arrangement.

The Zel production team really believed in this song, underlined when in July 1969 the team recorded another version with different lyrics but the same backing track. Jo Jo Petite - Joey - was released on Boss Records out of Gardena, California this version whilst again strong Northern Soul lacks the allure of Jeanette's charismatic beckoning.

The more I listen to Little Jeanette the more I become enamoured by her style, her poise and ease she delivers "Crazy Crazy". A neglected allniter candidate, especially for the DJ who enjoys those gems missed by everyone else..

A cool tune saturated in belated possibilities..

Why this talented Californian Soul Man with the sizzling vocal only recorded a couple of 45's and a highly regarded album is a mystery to me. He wrote his own music, he processed a scintillating voice, I'm sure there's a story why this talent never progressed to great things.

This his first 45 of two, is just proper Northern Soul from the "Bay" brilliantly arranged by Jack Cortes; writer, producer who had already plied his trade with Bay Area Soul star Bobby Freeman. Taking all his earlier experience into injecting high-energy into this relentless release of impassioned Soul. Chuck's tortured, beseeching wailings woven into a thumping pacey pulses, with ever more muscular moody horns enriching the arrangement. The blending of his personal pain, with the empathizing brass is so convincing.. this is top-drawing real-deal Northern Soul at it most persuasive.

Then there's the flipside "I Love Her - Need Her" again is a thumping slab of Northern, clearly showcasing Chuck's raw-to-the-bone vocal style...bridged by a searing sax display that demands more that one listen.

another neglected Northern Soul rarity, saturated in huge potential.

Virginian Gene Rumley with his Team Beats serves up a classy, delicious example of 60s small town local vocal group Northern Soul harmony. If the label didn't tell you, you'd be forgiven for thinking this was an obscure Chicago street corner symphony on a tiny neighbourhood label.

But this five man gathering are from Martinsville, Virginia given an outing by the same highly regarded "local" talent outlet "Raven Records". Responsible for such vigorously sought after 45's by the "The Lost Soul", "The Prodigals", "Soul Masters" etc. A local label of repute for putting out local "Soul" "Garage" "Jazz" all release today are sought after.

This example for me is not only one of the most elusive it is also one of its very best. With more than one collectable genre serviced by it's brilliance. A Northern Soul stroller saturated in class, a lowroder delight with sweet vocal dripping off every word. With the added bonus of wicked MOD/Boogaloo/Jazz instrumental hidden away on the flipside.. a muscular sax/Hammond/piano dancer.. "Sorry 'Bout That" needs to make no apologies for it contrasting dance side...

Whilst the lead side "I Want To Be Your Baby" is an utterly superb vocal-group Northern Soul winner, at a pace that's starting to set a precedent, especially within the Sunday chill-out culture.
